<p><u>Notes</u></p> <p>Mrs Britt teaches music and French on a Tues/Thurs pm to both classes and both classes are taught PE by Learn, Play, Achieve sports coaches on a Tuesday afternoon.</p> <p>Children must bring their coat and a named water bottle to school every day. Children are to learn their spellings and practise times tables on a regular basis.</p> <p>Children are expected to spend at least 20 minutes a week on their times tables; tasks are set online through Times Table Rock Stars for children to complete. Certificates are rewarded when a new rockstar status is achieved. Your child's individual login details can be found in their 'Reading Record and Weekly Diary'.</p> <p>Spelling tests take place on a Friday and new spellings will be handed out.
